
I. Companies B and M, Sixth Cavalry, will proceed at once to an available point in the vicinity of Old Camp Crittenden, and establish a Camp with a view to the protection of the settlers in the San Pedro and Santa Cruz Valleys.

Thirty days supplies will be taken by each company from its present post, and all supplies thereafter required will be drawn from the post from which the companies respectively depart.

II. The enlisted men of companies B and M, Sixth Cavalry, now on detached service in connection with the Military Telegraph Line, will so remain until the completion of the work now being done.
