Dear Senator Hayden:

The Secretary of the Army has asked me to reply further to your inquiry dated 7 March 1955, citing the need for rehabilitation of family quarters at Fort Huachuca, Arizona.

The Deputy Chief of Staff for Logistics has advised me that the minimum work necessary to rehabilitate existing family quarters at Fort Huachuca, as reported by the Commanding General, Sixth Army, is as follows:

Rehabilitation of permanent quarters	74 units	\$306,014
Modernize temporary quarters	<u>379</u> units	<u>1,374,513</u>
Totals	453	\$1,680,527

Improvement of family quarters at Fort Huachuca was not programmed for FY 1955, because funds made available for this purpose were limited, and projects of higher priority within the Sixth Army area were selected for accomplishment.

Fifty-six (56) permanent quarters are included in a proposed program for Rehabilitation of Family Housing for FY 1956. The remaining units will be programmed for accomplishment as funds become available.

For your additional information, 450 units of permanent family quarters for Fort Huachuca are planned for inclusion in the FY 1956 Military Public Works program at an estimated total cost of \$6,219,000.
