Subject: Construction--Fort Huachuca

Pursuant to your request, there is attached a brief description of the construction authorized and funding approved for additional construction work at Fort Huachuca under the Supplemental Appropriation Bill, 1958.

The Supplemental Appropriation Bill, 1958, presently before the President awaiting signature, contains funds in the amount of \$310,000,000 for Military Construction, Army. Included in the listing of projects approved for funding from the above appropriation is \$2,703,000 for Fort Huachuca, New Mexico. Line items include:

2 Enlisted men's barracks (326-man)	\$1,328,000
1 Battalion Mess	363,000
1 Battalion Administration and Supply Building	245,000
1 Hangar w/shops	616,000
1 Motor Repair Shop	86,000
1 Hard Stand	42,000
1 Motor Park Facilities	23,000

The first three (3) items are newly authorized, the latter four (4) were approved by the 84th Congress. Indications from the Army are that these items will be placed under contract during the year.

With reference to future plans, the Army has advised that their requirements have not yet been formalized and presented to the Secretary of Defense. However, the long range plans for Fort Huachuca are such as to safely anticipate that construction will continue for several years, current world situations remaining unchanged.
