

Dear Governor Osborn:

Reference is made to letter dated April 21, 1947, signed by T. B. Larkin, Major General, The Quartermaster General, War Department, copy of which was forwarded to this office, requesting information as to whether or not a city or county government of the State of Arizona, or the State itself, has any interest in acquiring the post cemetery at Fort Huachuca and assuming the obligation of perpetual maintenance.

As far as we know, the Arizona Game and Fish Commission is the only branch of the State government evidencing any desire to acquire any part of the lands of Fort Huachuca should this military reservation become surplus to the War Department. Since it is probable that the post cemetery is located in the general area of permanent improvement installations on the Military reservation, and since the Arizona Game and Fish Commission is interested only in acquiring the rangelands of the reservation, the Commission does not have any interest in assuming perpetual maintenance of the post cemetery.
