December 10th 1882.

It is hereby ordered that the tract of
country in the territory of Arizona,
lying and being within the
following described boundaries, viz:
beginning on the one hundred and
tenth degree of longitude west from
meridian, at a point 30° 30' north,
thence due west to the one hundred
and eleventh degree of longitude
west, thence due south to a point
of longitude 30° 30' north, thence due
east to the one hundred and tenth
degree of longitude west, thence due
north to place of beginning, or and

the same is hereby withdrawn from
 settlement and sale, and set apart
 for the use and occupancy of the
 'Moqui, and such other Indians
 as the Secretary of the Interior may
 see fit to settle thereon.
