Dear Mr. Scott:

Reference is made to your letter of the 18th instant relative to money diverted in connection with the well-drilling program contemplated on the Navajo Jurisdictions.

It is proposed to drill and equip ten wells on Western Navajo at a total cost of approximately \$48,000 and it will be necessary for you to set aside a like amount for this purpose. Office letter of June 23, 1934, advised you that \$7,000 had been set up for well drilling on Western Navajo. Office letter of September 19, 1934, authorized an additional \$23,000 to carry out well drilling and other water development work. Possibly after a close scrutiny of E.C.W. funds, the balance necessary to carry out the well drilling program could be diverted from other projects.
