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MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING COVERING THE BUILDING OF A DRAINAGE CHANNEL TO PROTECT FORT DEFIANCE FROM TORRENTIAL STORMS.

July 8, 1937

\$3,000 to finance this project will be made from the following funds:

New Hospital Equipment Fund,	\$1,000.
Roads Fund,	250.
ECW,	250.
Conservation Health,	500.
Schools,	500.
Agency,	500.

To begin this project, the hospital equipment fund will carry all labor on their payroll until the \$1,000 is exhausted.

ECW can be called upon for materials and supplies to the extent of the \$250. allotted to them.

The Roads Division will have active charge of this project, and will make progress report each week covering expenses and general progress of the work.

Drawings showing plans and profiles of all construction work will be prepared by the Roads Division, in order to make a permanent record of the work done. These drawings will also indicate the sewer lines which will be crossed by the drainage channel, and changes in sewer construction made necessary by the drainage channel.

The present channel in the vicinity of the new hospital will be cleared of all debris that has recently accumulated in connection with the construction of the new hospital. This material will be cleaned out by the contractor under the direction of Mr. McGinty, so that the channel excavation past this section will not be held up on account of this debris.

It will be necessary to move immediately one garage and a part of a dwelling house. Mr. Trotter, Mr. Patterson and Dr. Vietzke have made arrangements whereby this move can be made immediately, so that no interference will result. The moving of these buildings will be a part of this project.

Several other buildings which need to be moved in connection with the general clean-up will be started at this time under the same project. However, if the finances set up for this project

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are not sufficient to include the moving of these other buildings, the expense of this latter move will be borne by an additional fund raised by the several parties who are directly interested in this latter move.
