Dear Mr. McKee:

Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of March 22, 1930 requesting information regarding certain fossils reported found in 1928 by this Service during the course of work done on the Charlie Day Spring at Tuba City, Arizona.

It is believed that the spring to which you refer is the one located at the Western Navajo Agency and you can no doubt secure full information regarding the discoveries there from Superintendent C.L. Walker whose address is Tuba City, Arizona.

Our records, however, show that six springs in the Butte country under the Leupp jurisdiction, ranges 19, 20, 21 E and 22, 23, and 24 N. G. & S.R. meridian were purchased about 1919 from one Charles L. Day and it may be one of these springs you have reference to. The development of these springs was no doubt done by or with the knowledge of Mr. A.H. Womack, our general foreman in charge of Navajo and Hopi water development, located at Polacca, Arizona, from whom you could secure the desired information.
