Dear Mr. Robinson:

I am very sorry to inform you that the floods we have recently had were so much larger than the ones we have had heretofore that they ran a foot or more over the top of the head gates in the Moencopi Wash. The entire canal, 1,500 feet long, was filled with mud and drift. It will probably cost us \$400.00 or \$500.00 to clean it out, and when this is done the lining of the ditch will probably be found to be in such bad condition that some relining will have to be done immediately. We also need a much larger head gate for use as a sluice gate at the lower end of the main ditch so that when opened it will allow the free passage of some of the drift and debris.

This report is made in order that you may know what we are up against, and set aside money from any savings, or otherwise, that you could use to make these much needed repairs. Anything you could do for us will be very much appreciated.
