My dear Mr. Robinson:

I thank you for sending to me the negatives and prints referred to in your favor of the 13th instant, and for the suggestion that I have my camera repaired before I try to secure other pictures.

Relative to the concrete lining put into our ditch by Mr. Cobb and which has now caved in in several places, I can only state that it will probably be best not to try any repair work until after the need for water has become less urgent than now. When I can see Mr. Womack over here I shall have him suggest what should be done, but if Mr. Post should be anywhere near I should like to have him look the work over too. The entire lower end of the ditch was not lined high enough and the water is over the sides, all of which has a tendency to exert added pressure on the lining which became too great in several places when rain water was added to the moisture already in the ground.

If our ditch should be empty again some time I will try to secure a photograph of the breaks for your information and records.
