Dear Mr. Meyer:-

Replying to yours of July 1st. The films mailed were duly received, developed and a few days ago the negatives with one print were returned to you. I kept a set of three each of the prints that I thought were available for the annual report and will send them in. I notice that your camera seems to have a hole in the bellows and is leaking light badly and would suggest you look it over before taking any more pictures.

I note that you state that the "concrete lining is caved in in several places." I wish you would give me a little more detail as to what needs to be done and if you could send a photograph or two showing this I could judge better what was necessary. The photographs you sent in did not show anything out of the way and a personal letter from one of your employees to Mr. Cobb stated that the lining put in was in fine shape. If there is some work to be done, when Mr. Womack is in that vicinity he could give you the best advice as to what should be done. Mr. Post will probably be in the field and on the Navajo Reservation by the 1st of August and if the necessity is great enough I could send him over but if the damage done has been very small perhaps it would not pay to send him out there as his salary and travel expense will amount to \$8.00 or \$9.00 a day and as you know we must economize wherever we can, especially on travel expense.

If you will advise me further in the matter, I will decide what is best to be done in the matter.
