To All Farm Aids:

During the summer while sheep, goats cattle and horses were being grazed on the mountain area of Northern Navajo, there was a considerable loss from them eating poison weeds. There were quite a number that have also died on the lower country.

You are requested to forward a report to me the number of all classes of stock that have died from the effects of poisonous plants on the range during the past year.

The report should cover the number effected from loco weed, sneeze weed, whorled milkweed, pingue (gumplant - rubber plant) or other noxious weeds prevalent in your districts. Your statement should also include the number of effected animals that have recovered.

Care should be exercised in making this report since it is possible that the combined information will constitute a jurisdiction report which will be forwarded to the Washington office. We are hopeful that we shall obtain assistance in weed eradication work

Your early reply will be appreciated.
