NOXIOUS WEED SURVEY

INSTRUCTIONS

In order that this Office may have accurate figures covering weed infestation on areas of land lying within Indian reservations, Superintendents and others in charge of reservations and schools are requested to make a very careful survey and fill in the blank on the reverse side of this sheet.

Only the perennial weeds that are noxious in character should be included. Such weeds as wild oats, fan weed, cockle bur, and dandelions can be controlled by careful cultivation and are not to be listed. On account of the serious damage resulting from infestations of PUNCTURE VINE, it is probably the only annual weed that need be included. Some plants such as Johnson Grass may be good grazing on the range, but a serious pest on the farm; therefore, only the acreage where it is actually doing damage to other crops should be included in this table.

This survey should be completed and submitted to the office of Extension and Industries, 423 Clift Building, Salt Lake City, Utah, by November 15, 1932.
