

BY-LAWS AND REGULATIONS FOR THE TUBA CITY

LAND BOARD

There shall be three members on the Tuba City Land Board; one of which shall be a Hopi farmer. The President shall be elected by Land Board members and shall be the presiding officer at all meetings. The term of office is: two members are to serve two year terms and the other member to serve three year term.

Section I.

If a number of applicants are being considered for an assignment, (qualifications being equal), priority shall be given to those who show that they are in greatest need of the assignment.

Section II.

If an assignee does not make full beneficial use of his assignment during the growing season, he shall be called before the Land Board and if he can offer no reasonable justification why his assignment was not fully utilized, his assignment shall be cancelled. If his reasons are justifiable he shall be given one more growing season in which to make full beneficial use of his assignment.

Section III.

The Land Board will re-assign cancelled assignments where practical and feasible, to adjoining assignees who are making beneficial use of their present land, to increase the size of such assignments to approach an economic unit.

Section IV.

There will be no hogan or house built within what was formerly known as the Tuba City School Farm, or on any future assignments, by any assignee.

Section V.

There shall be no assignments made to any assignee who is not 20 years of age.

Section VI.

Before an assignment is made by the Land Board the prospective assignee must appear before the Land Board for final approval.

Section VII.

An assignee who uses "pump" irrigation shall obtain permission from the Land Board to pump his irrigation water. Failure to obtain this permission will result in the recommendation to the Superintendent that his assignment be cancelled.

Section VIII.

All canals and laterals must be cleaned before water is turned into them. All farmers using such laterals must do their full share of cleaning and maintaining them. Should a farmer fail to be represented during said cleaning, he shall be penalized at the rate of \$ 3.00 per day for the number of days required to complete the cleaning.

Section IX.

It shall be the responsibility of all farmers to see that all diversion headgates are closed, while the washes are in flood stage.

Section X.

It is recommended that wherever practical, corrugation method of irrigation be used.
