INDIAN LAND ALLOTMENTS.

WHEREAS, it has been made to appear to this Association that the Indian Department is rapidly increasing the amount of lands in this State dedicated to Indian Service and employed in grazing; and

WHEREAS, none of this land is subject to taxation within this state; and

WHEREAS, in some instances, the appropriated land is very considerably removed from the land formerly owned by the Indians; and

WHEREAS, it has come to our notice that a very considerable amount of the land dedicated to the Indian Service is by the Indians leased to outside interests; and

WHEREAS, it has come to our notice that adequate and economical grazing regulations are not employed in the Indian Service.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the New Mexico Wool Growers' Association in executive board meeting assembled at Albuquerque, New Mexico this 18th day of September, 1929, that until the Indian lands now owned are entirely employed by the Indians in economical and useful pursuits, we respectfully protest any further allotments of land in the State of New Mexico.
