Dear Mr. Balmer:

I submit the following in T 23 N R 19 E, that I have for sale. Store building that has cost me \$3462.00, size 33' x 80' x 11', wall in front and 10' high in back 18 inches thick. Quarters for help \$1000.00 Gas pump and tank \$150.00, corrals \$500.00.

Water development in Sec. 21, where above improvements are located at a cost of approximately \$2500.00 consisting of two wells in excellent condition and a surface flow of water sufficient for school, hospital, etc.

Dug well in Sec. 13, with plenty of water at a depth of 65 feet at a cost of more than \$1600.00. This well was used one summer, but I have not walled it up. Corrals at above well at a cost of \$400.00. In addition to the above, I prospected for water in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 23 at considerable expense and struck water but the hole flooded full of dirt and must be reopened.

From the above you will see that I have approximately \$10,000.00 in improvements.

With reference to the business, I have checked over nearly all pawns and accounts and find that they amount to \$10,000.00 - a little more or less. These could be reduced considerably in the next 2 or 3 months - one third or more I think.

I would be willing to consider less than the face value of the pawns, in fact I think we could agree on a percentage satisfactory to both of us. I could dispose of the balance of my merchandise to other traders. I shall be glad to have you call and make a careful examination of the above.
