

Writ of Injunction.

The Territory of Arizona, to Constant Williams, as Agent for the Navajo  
Tribe of Indians, Laughing Singer, Sam, Interpreter, and Old Borey,  
Navajo Indians, GREETING:

The above named plaintiffs, having filed their complaint  
in our District Court against the above named defendants, praying for an  
injunction against said defendants requiring them to refrain from the  
commission of certain acts in said complaint and hereinafter more part-  
icularly mentioned;

On reading the said complaint in this action, duly verified  
and it satisfactorily appearing to the Judge of said Court that it is a  
proper case for an injunction, and that sufficient grounds exist therefor  
and the necessary and proper undertaking having been given;

Now, therefor, in consideration thereof, and of the particular  
matters in said complaint set forth, we do strictly command that you, the  
said Constant Williams, as Agent for the Navajo tribe of Indians, Laugh-  
ing Singer, Sam, Interpreter, and Old Borey, Navajo Indians, each and  
every of you, until the further order of said Court, you and each of you,  
your, and each of your servants, agents, employes, counselors, and all  
persons acting under the direction, employment, control or management or  
or authority of you or each of you, do absolutely desist and refrain from  
building or causing to be built any dam or dams across Mean Copi Wash

in Coconino County, Arizona, or any tributary thereof, and particularly from building any dam or dams across that tributary of said Wash known as the "Togus Jay," or from in any manner or to any extent interfering with the flow of water in said Moen Copi Wash or any tributary thereof, or from in any manner obstructing or interfering with the free and exclusive use thereof by plaintiffs; and in case that you, the said defendants, or either of you, your agents, servants, employees, or any other person acting under the direction, employment, management, control or authority of you or either of you, have already built such dam or obstruction across said Moen Copi Wash or any tributary thereof, and particularly the said tributary known as "Togus Jay" you are strictly commanded forthwith to entirely remove the same, so that the flow of water therein for the free and exclusive use of plaintiffs be not in any manner interfered with.
