Dear Mr. Fryer:

We should like to have you give consideration to the case of Joel Posichoydoma, a Hotevilla stock owner who has for thirty years operated his sheep herd west of the Demebito Wash in the vicinity of the Demebito bridge. Besides Joel there are four other operators in the band of approximately 150 head. Our records indicate that they use for stock water the Demebito Wash, 3-N-65, and 3-N-161. This grazing use has been on a year-long basis up to last spring when Joel's herder was trespassed and fined for lack of a permit on District #3. As you know some of our Indians have felt that it should not be necessary for them to obtain permits to use land which they have controlled traditionally. Such was the case, I believe, with Joel. Last spring when the matter came up, we requested that Joel drop the case until such time as a definite boundary settlement was made for the Hopi. At the time we had been promised that a boundary settlement would be made in a very short time. Our information here concerning the boundary settlement is that individual cases along the periphery will receive such attention and will be settled on the basis of duration of use.

Until such a time as they investigate our matter, I will appreciate your Land Managing Division's issuing a temporary permit in District # 3 to Joel.
