Dear Mrs. Walther:

Thank you very much for your letter of November 2, enclosing copy of your letter to Senator O'Mahoney, which I appreciate.

Since my previous letter to you, we have had a short supplemental hearing on the Hopi matter here in Washington and took the testimony of a Mr. Adams, a missionary and a member of the Hopi tribe.

Your letter is very interesting and informative and I shall at the first opportunity present it to the Committee for consideration along with other testimonies being obtained. Arrangements have been made for the Indian office to furnish all decrees and historical data from which may be determined whether or not in fact the Hopi Indians have been restricted to the district which I understand has now been fenced. Mr. Adams seemed to acknowledge that fact, claiming, however, that it had been done illegally.
