
Sir:

I have the honor to report receipt of carbon copies of the Commissioner's letter, cited above, to Hon. Ralph H. Cameron, and the petition submitted by some Hopis for the enlargement of this reservation, and thank you for this information.

What the Hopis most need is something that will put them to honorable lucrative and continuous work and hold them there - a chance to make good similar to decent whites, under laws that will abolish boundary lines and century-old customs and pagan ceremonies which tend to increase idleness, encourage unmorality and hold them to insanitary communities.

This agency doubts if many of these Hopis know of this petition. This is the first I have heard of it.
