Washington:

Sir:

I have the honor to report receipt of copy your letter of June 12, mailed to King Naha, Polacca, this reservation and to state it is a proper adjustment of the matter, though at present there seems no dissatisfaction from the Nahas as to land matters.

It was reported in my letter of May 8 that we had given King a nice plot of agricultural land of about five acres, and that he has another home place near Polacca. He seems satisfied. It may be that Neal will ask for some home site latter and if he does it should be given him. These three boys are anxious to get some places on which they can work and raise something and this should be encouraged. They all have cattle running on the reservation under no fences. They also have sheep. They are doing nicely.

When the house is taken over by the Navajos the matter will be reported.
