

Dear Mr. Dickson :-

I am writing you in regard to the Navajo Ha-dilth-c'ah-li who has removed to the neighborhood of Keams Canyon. As you probably know, his was the first case to which the new inheritance regulation was made to to apply by your predecessor, Mr. J. E. Maxwell. This man was informed by Mr. Maxwell that so long as he lived in the jurisdiction of the Leupp Agency and conducted himself properly he would be protected in keeping the children and their sheep in spite of the opposition of the deceased wife's parents to the new regulation.

There has always been a determined purpose and effort to wrest the children and their sheep from this man, for^t his reason and because I felt that the inheritance regulation was a good one and should be strongly upheld I have defended him and given him every assistance I could give. I wish to say that I cannot any longer give him my support because in spite of oft repeated counsel he has violated all the conditions under which he was required to live.
