There is being forwarded herewith report on survey of boundary, District 6, Hopi Indian Reservation.

It will be noted that this report is approved by Byron P. Adams, Chairman of the Hopi Tribal Council and Burton A. Ladd, Superintendent of the Hopi Reservation. Contact was made at Window Rock with Mr. L. Hoffman, Acting Superintendent, Navajo Reservation and Mr. Lyle Young, Range Supervisor, Navajo Service, who retained one copy of the report with the understanding that they would forward same with their comments to Washington, D. C., for Superintendent Stewart's consideration and approval.

It is requested that if approval is given, that one copy of the report be returned to the Keams Canyon office for file. Two additional copies are retained here, one for the Navajo Service and one for the Forestry and Grazing Regional office in Phoenix.

I wish to express my appreciation to both the Hopi and Navajo personnel for their assistance in compiling data for this report, and especially to Mr. Albert Yava, Hopi Interpreter, who accompanied me on most of my field trips.

It is realized that a large amount of work remains to be done in bettering the economic condition of the Hopi, but it is felt that the foundation has been laid for a good beginning. Early boundary stabilization for District 6 will be of immense value to both the Hopi and Navajo services and it is respectfully requested that consideration be given same at the earliest opportunity.
