Sir:

On May 20, 1911, the Santa Fe Pacific Railroad Co., executed a deed of reconveyance to the United States for certain lands hereinafter described, using said lands as a basis of exchange in Phoenix 011632, act of April 21, 1904 (33 Stat. 211). 

Reference is made to Office letter of July 25 1922, to Superintendent Janus of the Leupp Agency (Land-Allot 30705-22 FGT) to which was attached copy of General Land Office letter holding for rejection the allotment application of Hoska-el-e-wood for the reason that it was in conflict with the Moqui Indian Reservation. The Office letter instructed Mr. Janus to have the application amended so as to cover lands outside the Indian Reservation. The trust patent for this Navajo covering the land on the reservation I find in the files. I am forwarding same with a relinquishment endorsed on the back, showing the lands wanted in lieu of that on the reservation.



Sir:

March 3, 1922, I filed in the local land office, an application to amend allotment application 011497 filed by Ka-on-nez-bega for his minor daughter, Schethe, from the NE 1/4 Section 2, Township 24 N., Range 18 E., G&SRM to the NE 1/4 Section 12, same township and range. The original application was in conflict with the Moqui Indian Reservation.

July 5, 1922, the General Land Office held the application for rejection (that is the original application), the same however was approved by the Department on September 27, 1922, and patent issued for lands described as Lots 1 and 2, S 1/2 of NE 1/4 Section 12 Township 24 N., Range 18 E.

If the trust patent was intended to cover the lands originally applied for the section is wrong, if the trust patent is intended to cover the lands wanted by way of amendment the description of the subdivisions is wrong.

I am returning herewith the trust patent with a relinquishment endorsed on the back and showing the lands wanted in lieu thereof, which are outside the Moqui Indian Reservation.
