Dear Gregory:

I am sending under separate cover another sample from the Keams Canyon well from 1203 feet.

I am in receipt of a letter from the driller this morning in which he says that he has reached 1309 feet, and doesn't believe that it will do any good to go deeper, and has quit drilling. He is in the same formation.

Will you wire Government rate, collect, as soon as you receive this you advice in the matter? If this is a failure, I scarcely know what to do with the rig next. If as you have said, this test should be a fair one for the entire region south of Black Mountains, and for the Hopi country, it might be best to make the next try east and north of Tohatchi.

I will await your advice before moving the rig.
