My dear Mr. Robinson:

I have your report on the water develop-
ment, Navajo and Hopi Reservations.

The point I wished particularly was to have
all the available data, in reference to each particu-
lar well or spring, together, so that it would not be
necessary to look through several histories or reports
in order to get all the data on each particular case.

Your report covers all the information de-
sired in most cases, but in some the data is more or
less incomplete; and also, there appear to be some in-
consistencies in that the well record would indicate
one thing and the information given under remarks would
indicate another.

The following list of wells appears to need
additional information to give a clear understanding of
the conditions now existing. You undoubtedly have this
record in your office and the data, noted as missing, in
reference to the particular wells indicated, would make
the matter much more clear:

- Well No. 1. No equipment shown. Probably
purchased and installed by school,
but nothing shown on record to this
effect.
- Well No. 2. No date. Equipment not shown.
- " " 3. " " " " " "

- " " 5. " " " " " "
- " " 4 M. No equipment shown.
- " " 5 M. No date.



flow and equipment not given.
" " 301. Nothing to show whether pump
was installed and whether use
is being made of well.
" " 306. What equipment was installed.
" " 307. Well record indicates a supply
of water, but under remarks is
the word, "dry". Does this mean
that well has failed? Equipment
not shown.
" " 308. Remarks to Well No. 307 apply.
" " 310. Well record and remarks apparently
not consistent.
" " 313. Does the word, "dry", indicate that
this well has failed?

In case you have data in your office that will
make any of the above more clear, I would be glad to have
you send it to me and I will have notes placed on the sheets
concerned so that the information will be as full and up to
date as it is possible to get it.
