Dear Mr. Miller:

I wish to report that the Chimopovy Water System is now complete. The engine and pump are working nicely. Our water supply is now absolutely sanitary. The water is piped from the spring by underground pipe to an underground reservoir, from which it is pumped up to the underground reservoir on the hill above the school plant. From this reservoir the water is distributed to all the buildings, by gravity, thru underground pipes.

We have installed our sanitary drinking fountain in the entrance hall of the school building conveniently located for the pupils of each schoolroom.

Provision is made for the Indians of the Village to get this water for drinking purposes. An overflow from the spring reservoir provides water for the stock that have to be watered there.

In digging the ditches and fixing up the spring the Indians gave us three days labor, ten men working each day.
