The troops having been wholly withdrawn therefrom, and the same being no longer required for military purposes, I have the honor to recommend that the military reservation of Fort Cummings, New Mexico, established by Executive Order of April 28, 1870, and enlarged by Executive Order of November 9, 1880, be transferred and turned over to the Secretary of the Interior under the Act approved July 5, 1884 (23 Stats., 103) for disposition under the terms of said act, or as otherwise provided by law.
