

MEMORANDUM FOR REGIONAL FORESTER

Reference is made to application for the appropriation of the Power's Garden water on the Aravaipa District, which was returned to your office a day or two ago.

Since forwarding this application, I have learned that certain mining interests on the Aravaipa District intend to file application for the appropriation of this water in the very near future. I would suggest, therefore, that our application be rushed to the Water Commissioner at the earliest possible date.

The application as forwarded to your office was for domestic use only. Since this application was filled out, it has been decided in this office that the application should have been for dual use. There is at Power's Garden a small plot of ground on which it is possible to raise such forage as the ranger would probably need at this administrative site and at certain seasons this spring will furnish enough water to raise such a crop of forage. It is, therefore, believed that we should change the application to include irrigation and increase the amount of water filed on to 1/2 second foot. I regret that these changes were not made before the application left this office.

CERTIFICATE OF WATER RIGHT

(For rights perfected under original, enlargement or secondary permits)

This is to Certify, That UNITED STATES FOREST SERVICE, CROOK NATIONAL FOREST, of SAFFORD, State of ARIZONA, has made proof to the satisfaction of the STATE WATER COMMISSIONER of Arizona of a right to the use of the waters of RATTLE SNAKE CANYON, a tributary of ARAVALPA CREEK, for DOMESTIC USE, IRRIGATION and STOCK WATERING PURPOSES, under Application No. A-2237, Permit No. A-1499 of the State Water Commissioner, and that said right to the use of said waters has been perfected in accordance with the laws of Arizona, and made and entered of record in the Records of the State Water Commissioner at Phoenix, Arizona, in Volume 4, at page 1248, on the 2nd day of JUNE, 1943; that the priority of the right hereby confirmed dates from JANUARY 5, 1940; that the amount of water to which such right is entitled and hereby confirmed, for the purposes aforesaid, is limited to an amount actually beneficially


used for said purposes, and shall not exceed 2.5 ACRE FEET PER ACRE PER ANNUM FOR IRRIGATION, 73,000 GALLONS PER ANNUM FOR DOMESTIC USE, and 18,250 GALLONS PER ANNUM FOR STOCK WATERING.

A description of the lands under such right, and to which the water hereby confirmed is appurtenant, or if for other purposes, the place where such water is put to beneficial use, is as follows:

FOR IRRIGATION, 0.5 ACRES IN SW 1/4 NW 1/4; 2.5 ACRES IN NW 1/4 NW 1/4; 3.0 ACRES IN SW 1/4 NE 1/4, AND 1.0 ACRE IN NW 1/4 SE 1/4 OF SECTION THIRTEEN (13), TOWNSHIP NINE (9) SOUTH, RANGE NINETEEN (19) EAST, GILA AND SALT RIVER MERIDIAN, GRAHAM COUNTY, ARIZONA. FOR DOMESTIC USE WITHIN THE SW 1/4 AND NW 1/4 OF SAID SECTION THIRTEEN, AND FOR STOCK WATERING WITHIN THE SW 1/4 OF SAID SECTION THIRTEEN. THE POINT OF DIVERSION UNDER THIS APPROPRIATION AND RIGHT TO THE USE OF WATER IS WITHIN THE NORTHEAST QUARTER OF THE SOUTHWEST QUARTER (NE 1/4 SW 1/4) OF SAID SECTION THIRTEEN, AT WHAT IS KNOWN AS POWERS GARDEN SPRING, WHICH IS S.86°-16'E. 1,391.1 FEET FROM THE WEST QUARTER CORNER OF SAID SECTION.

The right to the use of the water aforesaid hereby confirmed is restricted to the lands or place of use herein described, and subject to all prior existing rights.

Rights to the use of water for power purposes are limited to a period of forty years from the date of priority of the right, as herein set forth, subject to a preference right of renewal under the laws existing at the date of the expiration of the right for power purposes, as hereby confirmed and limited.
