MEMORANDUM FOR BRIGADIER GENERAL ROBERT S. MOORE

I am in receipt of a letter from Mr. Folsom Moore, who publishes a newspaper in Bisbee, Arizona, stating that he had visited Ft. Huachuca and is convinced that there is a great need at that post for recreational facilities such as a field-house, bowling alleys, stadium, service clubs, craft shops, and a post chapel. I assume that money for such purposes would have to come from the appropriations for health, welfare and morale.

Another feature is proper housing for civilian employees which might be provided under the Wherry Housing Act.

Mr. Moore also states that there is need for improved landing strips, additional warehouses, railroad trackage, power facilities and a means of storing aviation gasoline.

I am passing this information on to you with the idea that you may be able to ascertain whether any funds are now available for such purposes by transfer from existing appropriations and if not, whether the necessary funds can be included in the appropriations made for the next Fiscal Year.
