SUBJECT: Senator Hayden's Request Concerning Facility Requirements
at Fort Huachuca

1. The following information is submitted as a basis for replying to Senator Hayden's inquiry concerning Fort Huachuca, Arizona:

2. The General Staff is currently processing a request to establish Fort Huachuca as a permanent Class II installation under the jurisdiction of the Chief Signal Officer. The views of Senator Hayden's constituent, Mr. Folsom Moore, concerning facility requirements of Fort Huachuca, are factual and correct. They are in almost complete alignment with the long-range construction program recently submitted by the Commanding General of this installation.

3. Operational facilities for Fort Huachuca will be submitted in FY 1956 and future fiscal years MCA budget presentations to Congress. The number of items which will be submitted in any one year will depend upon budgetary guidance and limitations and relative priority of other Army requirements.

4. Until Fort Huachuca may be designated formally as a permanent installation, the station will not be eligible under the Wherry Act for a housing project. If designated, the Department of the Army will consider a Wherry project for the station. Requests for Wherry projects are initiated by the Station Commander thru the Commanding General of the Army and the Chief of the Technical Service concerned.

5. In regard to welfare and morale facilities, the Department of the Army will request the Bureau of the Budget to apportion \$2.104 million of a total residual obligational authority of \$6.663 million contained in Public Law 155, for authorization, and Public Law 254, for appropriation, of the Eighty-second Congress. During a period of austere budgetary limitations, this is the total value of welfare and morale type facilities presently scheduled for construction during FY 1955. However, a bowling alley for \$128,000 is listed for Fort Huachuca in the remaining \$4.559 million of obligational authority of the above public laws. It is hoped to initiate construction of this project at an early date. The Department of the Army is requesting Congress to fund in FY 1955 the \$7.5 million of authorization of Public Law 155 which was not funded by Public Law 254, both of the Eighty-second Congress. Contained in this list of \$7.5 million is a craft shop for Fort Huachuca at a cost of \$113,000. Construction of this facility is contingent upon favorable Congressional consideration of the above request.
