Peter,

Our Scientific Collection Permits specifically address mollusks and crustaceans. If there are requirements/permits at the state level, I don't know of them, but they would likely be through the Dept. of Agriculture. Perhaps the easiest source to find-out if any permit is required would be to check with the entomologists in your Dept.; they may have knowledge of any such requirements.

My general (and unofficial) understanding of the current situation is that, unless the insect is federally listed T, E or Candidate, or it's a species of special concern, you aren't req'd to have a permit/authorization to collect it. This may not be true on federally administered lands, such as National forests, parks, monuments, or wilderness areas; you will want to check with Heidi in that respect.
