

INFORMATION ABOUT
CERTIFICATES OF ENVIRONMENTAL COMPATIBILITY (CEC)
IN ARIZONA

You should start by reading Arizona Revised Statute 40-360. This Power Plant and Transmission Line Siting Committee law defines “plant” as “. . . each separate thermal electric, nuclear or hydroelectric generating unit with a nameplate rating of one hundred megawatts or more . . .” (Note that photovoltaic or wind generator projects are not subject to Committee review.) In addition, any new transmission line of 115 kV or more is subject to Committee review.

Click on "e-docket" (look for it at the bottom of the home page in the far right corner.)

Enter "L-00000" in the search box. (That's L followed by five zeros) Click "search"

The documents for each docket are in reverse order. The initial application should be the very first document filed back when the docket was opened.
