Yes, calendar year was my recommendation, However, at this point you should weigh the potential benefits of conversion from water year to calendar year against the costs. It seems to me that regardless of how the historical analysis is done, the final results of monthly or seasonal values for a water right could be set forth on a calendar year basis.
